FROM THE CHAIRMAN

During the past year The Friends' various activities have again proved very popular among the members, who have continued to give strong support both to our society and through it to our local museums. With the New Year already upon us, we now look forward to a programme of interesting lectures, outings and special events for 2016. Details of all these will be found in the following pages, as well as news about themselves and Museum activities by two new members of the curatorial team, Jess Dowdell and Emma Reeve.

The first event will be a specially arranged evening at the Castle Museum to view the exciting Fenwick Treasure, which was excavated a year ago by the Colchester Archaeological Trust at Williams and Griffin's in the High Street. Following conservation and preliminary display at Fenwick's London store in Bond Street, the firm's directors have agreed that this important deposit of first century jewellery should be placed into Colchester Museum's care in perpetuity. It is remarkable that these highly prized contents of a Roman lady's jewellery box should have survived the town's utter destruction by Boudicca and her followers and all those involved in contributing to their public display in the Castle Museum are to be congratulated. Please see the enclosed booking form for further details of this event on Wednesday 23rd March 2016.

All our other activities for 2016, including the lecture programme and summer outings, are listed below. I would also like to draw attention to an illustrated article by our Treasurer, Peter Evans, about our latest gift to the Museum. This is a photographic album, entitled *Colchester Illustrated*, which was published at his own expense by Alderman Wilson Marriage in 1892, the year after he had become Chairman of the Museum Committee. We are very grateful to

Peter for pursuing this acquisition and negotiating its purchase.

Now that so many more people are able to take photographs with their digital cameras and mobile phones, there must be a lot of interesting shots that members have taken at Friends' or museum-related events. We are endeavouring to create an archive of suitable images. If you have any relevant examples either now or in the future, I would be very pleased to hear from you (see inside front cover for details).

Can I remind you about John Constable's masterpiece Salisbury Cathedral from the Meadows 1831, which is currently on display at Ipswich's Christchurch Mansion until the end of January 2016. This is the most spectacular of all his monumental 'six footer' canvasses and if you have not seen it already, you are strongly advised to do so while there is still time. There are also many other works in the permanent collection by Constable and Gainsborough, which are the best to be found outside London. Colchester has a few drawings by John Constable too!


includes, of course, the continued benefit of being able to visit the Castle Museum at no additional cost.



Apart from the link to Wilson Marriage, one of Colchester's most distiguished citizens of his time, the images, by local photographer William Gill, are interesting in themselves.

Some the views may be familiar, but they are are not photographs but platinotypes, which are more rare. They were developed in the 1870's and platinium was used in the development process, giving a better definition of the image. The process ceased in the 1920s due to the high costs.

The book has been bound in red leather and has an illuminated front page.



Tuesday 19th July Day trip to Hever Castle £32 per person

Pick up in Crouch Street or at Marks Tey Hotel. For those boarding the coach at the Marks Tey Hotel there will be an extra charge of £1 per car. You need to park round the back of the hotel in the far car park.

Leaving Colchester at about 9am we hope to arrive at Hever Castle in Kent at about

11am. We will be leaving Kent at 4.30 pm to arrive back in the Colchester area at about 6.30pm.

Hever Castle and gardens is the perfect setting for a day out. It is an attractive fortified manor house surrounded by a moat. The original moated castle was built in 1270 and consisted of a massive gatehouse and walled bailey approached by a wooden drawbridge.

In the late 15th century the castle became home to the Bullen (Boleyn) family who built a comfortable Tudor house within the walls. The splendid rooms contain

fine furniture, tapestries, antiques and an important collection of Tudor paintings. There are also two prayer books inscribed and signed by Anne Boleyn, second wife of Henry VIII.

This is a magnificent place to learn about the Tudors as well as the Astor family, who were the owners for 80 years from 1903 and were responsible for most of what we see today.

The award winning gardens are set in 125 acres of glorious grounds, with statues and various ornamental ponds. There is a fascinating collection of miniature houses and a beautiful lake and there are gift shops and restaurants on site.

Museum News

COLCHESTER CASTLE

Introducing Jess Dowdell and Emma Reeve, Collections and Learning Curators.

As Tom Hodgson outlined in the last edition, Emma Reeve and I have recently started with Colchester Museums as Collections and Learning Curators. This challenging new role will ensure that we embed engagement and learning into all our activities. My background is within university museums, notably the University of Queensland where I worked with Mediterranean collections for over six years. I have relocated from down under (Australia) to expand my opportunities in the museum sector and indulge my love for prehistory and Roman material culture. My professional and academic background has focused on learning and engagement with historical collections and I am excited to bring this experience to an

organization with this at its core.

Some notable current projects I am involved with include the display of the Burnham-on-Crouch Bronze Age hoard, documentation of the Roman glass collections and 'Out of the Box' curator engagement events.

The display of the Burnham-on-Crouch hoard is long overdue as it was first uncovered in 2010. This hoard includes over 214 metal items as well as associated pottery. In a display in Colchester Castle's community case from mid-December, I hope to highlight not only this magnificent hoard, but also the importance of the portable antiquities scheme and treasure act in ensuring that these objects are available for public consumption. Along with our current Finds Liaison Officer, Ben Paites, we will be hosting a lecture presentation in conjunction with the display in January.

The Roman glass being documented over the next few months includes a large amount of material excavated in the 1970s-80s by the Colchester Archeological Trust, as well as a few items noted in Hawkes and Hull from the 1930s. The aim is to increase the accessibility of the collection for researchers and the wider public. I also hope to engage volunteers and students in later parts of the project. I will be providing fortnightly updates on a collections blog that can be accessed via our website www.cimuseums.org.uk/article/16919.

The 'Out of the Box' curator engagement events are nothing revolutionary. They seek to connect audiences with objects that are not on display. Each month one member of our Collections and Learning team will prepare a handling table, tour, or event in one of three venues. In October I was in the Castle looking at objects connected to individuals who created the Castle we know today. I have enjoyed learning about historical characters including Eudo, Edward the Elder and Charles Grey. However, by far the greatest adventure has been getting to know former museum curator Rex Hull through his diaries, photos, and beautiful illustrations. In November Emma Reeve brought out one of the collection's most significant manuscripts. Further details of events will be posted on the 'what's on' page on our website www.cimuseums.org.uk/whatson.

JESS DOWDELL
Collections and Learning Curator

I am thrilled to be working for Colchester and Ipswich Museums, especially in a role which allows me to experience the full breadth of the collections alongside creating fantastic events and working with schools. Our team is working to re-invigorate the adult events programme, alongside keeping the current high-quality events for children.

In my first few weeks I was heavily involved with Heritage Open Days, which

were fantastic ways for a new Colcestrian to get to know the town and its rich history. Currently, I am working with a colleague to catalogue an archive of Colchester photographs which has come to the museum from Newsquest, a group of local newspapers. I have relished the opportunity to learn more about Colchester's recent past and the events many local people hold dear. I am also working on an exhibition for the space in Hollytrees, which will begin in March 2016.

I am originally from Nottingham, and moved to Norwich in 2008. I graduated from Norwich University of the Arts in 2011 with a degree in Visual Studies. Following this I organised art exhibitions in Norwich and the surrounding area, including a garden at the Bergh Apton sculpture trail.

In 2013 I joined Norfolk Museums
Service's Teaching Museum scheme and
worked on the Castle Keep redisplay at
Norwich. This project, similarly to Colchester,
was part-funded by the EU through Norman
Connections. Through this I was lucky enough
to meet several colleagues from CIMS and visit
Colchester Castle during its redevelopment.
Following the end of my time at Norwich
Castle, I ran 'Norfolk 2000', an Arts Council
funded project which combined art and
archaeology on the theme of immigration.

Alongside this, I worked at Norwich's Sainsbury Centre for Visual Arts as part of an MA in Museum Studies, which I completed in June of this year.

I'm excited about promoting inclusive and accessible museums and along with art and archaeology I also have experience in social media marketing. I hope to work with the team at CIMS to increase our online interaction with new audiences, and strengthen connections with our existing followers.

RECENT ACQUISITION:

Second World War German POW prints

One of the Museum Service's most recent acquisitions is a collection of material relating to a German prisoner of war, who was held from 1945 at P.O.W Camp 186 at Berechurch Hall in Colchester.

Kurt Stichling worked in the camp's print room, resulting in a fascinating collection of small woodcut prints. The print shown here is entitled *The Infirmary*.

Along with the prints are a number of postcards that show correspondence between Kurt and his wife Nelly back in Germany, and notebooks filled with writing in English, showing that Kurt was learning the language during his time in the camp. The double page spread shown below is entitled *Christmas in*



Germany and Daily Life in Camp,' a contrast between Kurt's homeland and his present situation.


